
Baptism

Hi Everyone,

By God's grace our trip back to South Sudan was postponed after a powerful warning we both got in the Spirit. We're now scheduled to leave Australia in April and are currently in Adelaide visiting a dear friend who's very unwell.

We're still packing containers and have a wonderful opportunity to send thousands of bibles by sea to South Sudan. We thought it would be wonderful to flood the region with the word of God and are busy collecting as many bibles as possible. If you have a spare bible or two please let us know and we'll give you an address to send them too. By God's grace the official language of South Sudan is English and while literacy is poor there are often one or two people in a family group who can read English. Having Bibles will also help with literacy in schools etc. as students will have access to reading material.

Please pray for Sudan/South Sudan, the region is very unstable as the conflict is widening; the market in our nearest town was targeted by rebels and burned to the ground. Food is in short supply for many and starvation is looming. Our children get distressed when they witness so much hunger around them. Please pray for a multiplication of people and resources (especially food) to help the poor and share God's love.

Read Ephesians 2:1-4

- Q1. How would you describe your life before you came to know Jesus as Lord and Saviour?
- Q2. How do you feel about Paul describing your pre-Christian life as being dead-in-your-sins? What does being dead-in-sin mean to you?
- Q3. How would you explain sin to someone who didn't know what it meant?

The word sin literally means to 'miss the mark'. The picture is one of a target and an arrow. Sadly no one can fire an arrow well enough and straight enough to hit God's target all the time.

- Q4. Do you think it's fair that God get's to set the target. Surely our opinions, feelings and preferences have to be taken into consideration?
- Q5. Paul says in v2 that when we were dead in our sins we were in deed 'obeying the devil who is the spirit at work in the hearts of those who refuse to obey God'. How do you feel about this?



Paul is making it clear that being dead in sin is in fact a spiritual state. It is a spiritual state that is opposed to God, when you refuse to follow His commands you are not neutral, you become his enemy under the authority of Satan. No wonder he is angry.

Q6. When we are dead-in-sin how do we view are own desires, passions, inclinations and appetites?

To be dead and following Satan doesn't sound good, yet the world believes that being good is what God wants. Darren said in his sermon that God does not make a good v. bad distinction. He sees dead or alive. We are either dead in our sin or alive in his son.

Q7. What does it mean to you be alive in his son? Especially as we know that we all still sin. What exactly has changed?
