Who is in the centre of Your Christmas Story?

The Christmas story, as told in the Gospel of Luke, focuses on two couples preparing to have a baby. Two! I hear you cry, we know about Mary and Joseph, who are the other couple. Well, their names are Zechariah and Elizabeth and they are the expectant parents of John the Baptist.

Luke writes in the first chapter of his book, that Zechariah had been told by an angel that his little son was born to get the people of Israel ready to meet Jesus. And according to the angel readiness looked like three things;

- Turning the hearts of the people back to God
- Opening their hearts to each other
- Seeking wisdom to live God's way

I'm aware that a lot of effort goes into preparing for Christmas, putting up trees and decorations, buying and preparing food, purchasing and wrapping presents and managing stressful family dynamics. At times it is overwhelming and stress and tiredness dominate our preparations and before we know it one of two things happens:

- We become the center of the Christmas story with our complaints, exhaustion, stress and grumpiness.
- Someone else becomes the center of the Christmas story as we get critical, resentful and judgmental.

Maybe this Christmas season we need to deliberately take the posture of John. He was not the center of the Christmas story himself, but he prepared the way for others to engage with the one who was. Maybe this Christmas we can help others stop, rest and seek a greater and deeper significance to our celebrations. Maybe this Christmas we can be the ones intentionally helping people to open their hearts to each other. Maybe this Christmas we can seek the wisdom to live the way God wants and so bless others with lives of patience,

compassion, grace and mercy.

Maybe this Christmas we can agree that we are not the center of the Christmas story,


