Read Ephesians 4:1-8

Q1. If you were to describe someone who was humble and someone who was proud what words would you use?

In Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus said that he was humble and gentle in heart and that we should learn from him.

Q2. Read John 2:13-22 - Does Jesus' behaviour in clearing out the Temple fit with your understanding of humility, or is it closer to pride?

When Moses told God he was not a good speaker did God commend him on his humility? When the 10 spies brought their report back from the promised land saying that they were grasshoppers in the eyes of the lands inhabitants did God say oh what heart warming humility? No he didn't he was actually quite angry.

Q3. In the light of these passages and the sermon on Sunday what do you now believe is the Biblical understanding of humility?

Q4. God clearly says through Paul in Ephesians 4:7 that each one of us has been given a special gift for the building up of the church in love? What is your immediate response to this?

Q5. If you say you don't have any gifts or have a special and necessary place in the body of Christ, do you realise that you are not being humble but actually lacking in faith? You are not believing what God says about you and have fallen for Satan's most ancient tactic..."Did God really say"?

Q6. Do you agree with Darren's statement that humility is confidently doing what God has told you to do for Him and pride is at the heart of not believing and acting on what God says is true about you?

National Award for Kauwe Purruna

“A Bush School keeping First Nations children in care connected to culture were celebrated at the annual Anglicare Australia Awards”.

I am so pleased to announce that Sam Sands a foster carer from Gawler and a regular at Riverside Play Cafe, was recognised with a ‘Highly Commended’ award in the Reconciliation category for the Kauwe Purruna Bush School, which works to address gaps in opportunities for cultural learning for First Nations children in care.

The Bush School was Sam’s vision to ensure the First Nations child in her care remained deeply connected to culture, community, and Country. She partnered with Riverside Salvation Army, and local First Nations organisations to develop the weekly sessions that take place on the grounds at Riverside.

Kauwe Purruna, which means water of life/well being provides a safe space where children in care and their foster families gather to learn on Country with Elders and cultural leaders sharing knowledge through art, language, storytelling, and connection to land. The Purruna Garden team also connect in with the group and as you have probably been able to work out were integral in forming the bush school’s name. Well done to Sam and all who support her, namely Rob Adami, Rick and Mandy Mierisch and the Garden Team and of course the Riverside Leadership Team.

Josh and the Garden team recently won a grant to further enhance the gardens, this includes disabled access to the community garden, more growing beds, a fire pit and yarning circle and further work in the gardens at the front of the building. They have already started doing this and I have to say it looks beautiful.
