Wed Matthew 26:6–16, Mark 14:3–11, Luke 22:3–6.

Thu Matthew 26:17–75, Mark 14:12–72, Luke 22:7–71, John 13:1–18:27.

Fri Matthew 27:1–61, Mark 15:1–47, Luke 23:1–56, John 18:28–19:42.

Sat Matthew 27:62–66.

Sun Matthew 28:1–20, Mark 16:1–8, Luke 24:1–53, John 20:1–21:25.
